Club Constitution & Workshop

Many clubs will be coming up to the Swim England East Region 4 yearly review of their constitutions. The process for reviewing and updating is as follows:

- The club's committee needs to review and update to the new model as required, there may be exceptions for Incorporated and Charitable status clubs, consult Chris Galer, East Region Membership Officer (membership@eastswimming.org)
- The club's committee needs to agree and date the new constitution.
- The constitution then needs to be emailed to Chris Galer, East Region Membership Officer

(membership@eastswimming.org) for approval

- 4. The Membership Officer will confirm it is all in order or indeed, will provide advice and guidance to amend/correct
- Once he has approved it, it can be presented to your membership for acceptance at your AGM/SGM.
- After the AGM/SGM, the constitution and a copy of the minutes should be emailed to the Membership Officer along with a list of eligible <u>voting</u> members that were present along with their Swim England membership numbers
- 7. On receipt, the Membership Officer will then issue the club with a new affiliation certificate.

In any case, your club constitution should be reviewed by the club committee annually to ensure that it is still relevant and fit for purpose. Any changes that are required during the 4 years, please follow the above procedure. No constitution should be presented to a club's membership for approval without being approved by the Regional Membership Officer in the first instance.

Here is a list of common issues to pay attention to when reviewing:

- The title page has an information box on it to provide guidance as to how to prepare the first page, this should be removed
- The date on the first page should be the date the committee have agreed its contents. Please ensure that the footer date matches this.
- Please ensure that the correct title of any associations including your own club are used throughout e.g Swim England East Region particularly in 1.1 and 2.4
- Please ensure the wording in 7.1 accurately reflects how your committee is made up
