

Swim England East Region Discipline Leadership Group Development Plans 2024

Artistic Swimming Leadership Group:

Regional Grading Days:

The Artistic Swimming Leadership Group plan to hold grading days in January, March, May, July, October, November & December.

Regional Development Days:

We plan to hold 2 regional training days aimed at our Under 12s with Grade 1 or above to work on.

Regional Squad Training for and attending Regional Games:

We plan to hold 3 regional games training sessions before the competition in June.

Judge Level 1 Course:

This is to be held online. Level 2 and 3 judge courses are held nationally and with the new World Aquatics rules coming into play, tutors will be limited so will be offered to clubs.

Scorers Course:

This is to be held in person aiming for one course in the year. Due to the new scoring system coming into force in 2024 Chief Recorders are being asked to put on courses in their own region.

Regional Development Package:

The Artistic Swimming Leadership Group have offered a range of packages to each region. We as a region have decided that the most beneficial to us would be the offer for a webinar to be delivered to us. During 2022 and 2023 we signed up to webinars with Paola Basso for coaches and we all found these incredibly interesting and helpful to deliver better coaching to our swimmers.

Annual National Conference:

Clubs are encouraged to attend this at the end of each year to ensure that we are up to date on all things Artistic Swimming, aimed at coaches and judges.

Disability Swimming Leadership Group:

Regional Training Days:

The East Region Disability Swimming Leadership Group will delivery four training camps/days across the year, as per the guidance from Swim England and the development pathways set out. These camps traveling around the region across the year, to ensure they are accessible to all within the region.

Diving Leadership Group:

National Skills Finals (NSF) Judges:

This annual event is an excellent training event for development of judges. Skills is one of the most difficult events to judge as in-depth knowledge of technique is essential plus the confidence to give the appropriate score. The regions judges who have been fortunate to be supported by this programme previously have personally benefitted and used that knowledge to good effect at both regional and national championships. It is also a great stepping stone to becoming a Level 2 judge.

The expenditure in the budget will provide expenses for the EDLG's selected judges to attend the event.

Athletes and Coaches Camps:

For the most effective development programme we have decided to focus on combination camps. Lead presenters will enable coaches to become conversant with the latest coaching techniques whilst the selected divers will be developing their skills by learning new dives and methods under some of the best tutors in the country.

We have budgeted for the following development camps:

- January key themes:
 - Intro to weightlifting
 - o Yoga



- Hurdle drills (dryland and pool)
- May key themes:
 - o Ballet
 - Psychology (competition preparation)
 - Dryland and Pool training

Coaching Workshops:

These are fundamental building blocks for coaches. We want to extend the learning opportunities to include divers to act as pupils to the coaches with a win – win result.

Wet Rigging Workshop

We will hold a Wet Rigging course for Diving Coaches that are proficient in in trampoline and dryland rigging and are looking to transfer their knowledge to the pool rig. With it being an Olympic year, we are liaising with presenters to find a suitable date.

Handstand and Twist Workshop

The workshop will be held in a gymnasium and provide coaches with knowledge on how develop and train handstands as well as introduce drills and skill progressions for Armstand optional dives. The workshop will also educate coaches on twisting drills, progressions and supporting techniques. The coaches will also have the opportunity to ask the presenters for guidance and advice on dryland supporting techniques.

Officials/Volunteer Courses:

Officials' courses for recorders and announcers are important to ensure that we have adequate succession in place for volunteers. We are currently reliant on a number of individuals and to avoid key man dependency, particularly in respect of recorders, we are concentrating on education and mentoring of recorders and announcers.

We are proud of the work that we have done to develop volunteers in the region to date and hope that these two courses will help inspire new volunteers to help out with events at both a club and regional level.

Masters Swimming Leadership Group:

Masters Development Day:

The development day aims to cover a wide range of activities intended to improve the knowledge and understanding about the needs of athletes in this sport which our masters' swimmers might otherwise not get the chance to participate in. This includes, but is not limited to; fitness, diet and swimming techniques.

Communications:

The leadership group will improving communications with the Regional Masters Membership by producing a newsletter and by regularly updating news on the website.

County Representation:

It is very important to have all six counties represented at Regional meetings so filling the vacancies that exist is of major importance to the group, to ensure all counties and members have a voice.

Open Water Swimming Leadership Group:

Online Development Camp:

On-line open water skills and development day, featuring guest speaker from current BS international team participant. March or April 2024. Target audience age 12 to 18, with up to 250 participants.

Open Water Lake Day:

The Region will run an open water development day on Saturday the 8th of June, at Stanborough Lakes. Target participation age 12 to 18 open water experienced athletes with up to 50 participants.



Swimming Leadership Group:

As the middle tier of a tripartite structure of national, regional and county, the region will provide development opportunities to athletes in accordance with the national talent pathway.

Regional Talent Camp

This will accommodate 12 year old swimmers, aligning with the National Talent Pathway.

Regional Bursaries:

The Region has a Talent Athlete Bursary Scheme in place to part fund the participation of East Region athletes on National Programmes or Elite Activity. The region will continue to support this.

Bite-sized workshops:

The region continues to focus on the development of its coaches, and would like to provide two workshops per year, where we host a guest speaker to deliver a talk with our coaches, one aimed at level 3/ senior coaches, and one aimed at part time/ level 2 coaches.

Coaches Forum:

We continue to see the value of getting together some selected coaches from different areas of the region, to share and consult their views on a wide range of matters. These will continue online and therefore will have no cost for the region.

Regional Training Academy:
